Rip's GRAND Caribbean Adventures

Hola! Friends,

I have some bad news from the Caribbean. What started as a routine vet visit on the island turned far more sinister.

The day began with a fun ride in my wagon attached to Dad's bike. I enjoy these rides. My sister, Noriega, had to squeeze in, too. Because we're getting older, Mom and Dad decided we should get a senior blood panel done, which is good practice for older dogs. Noriega threw a fit for the blood draw, but I was an angel, as always. See the photo for proof!



Vet visits here are different, with everyone needing to see the vet waiting in the lobby, and the visits are conducted in the lobby, for everyone to see. Here, the vet knows Mom can hold us for a blood draw, so we get her instead of someone we don't know.

In Utila, heartworms are a serious problem. Many dogs are heartworm-positive, increasing the likelihood of dogs like me, on monthly heartworm prevention, contracting it. The presence of positive dogs and numerous mosquitoes is concerning.

Sad news: my sister and I have heartworms. I was stunned as Mom and Dad take such good care of us! Bernard tested negative, and I'm happy for him. He's lucky he has a lot of hair, making it harder for mosquitoes to sting him and pass along the heartworms. The good news is, because this is such a problem here, the vet's office is experienced in treating it! They treat heartworm slowly for safety. I will be on medication for about five months, and once I test negative, I'll get heartworm prevention twice a month for life. They recommend all dogs get prevention twice a month.



I always knew heartworms were a concern when I lived in the United States, so be sure your parents stay on top of prevention and annual testing. If you happen to contract heartworms, they are easier to get rid of the smaller amount of time you've had them. My sister and I will be fine and get through this; we're tough! I wanted to be sure to share this with my friends as a reminder about the importance of heartworm prevention.

Disaster PREP

I

t doesn't matter if it is a Hurricane, Wildfire, Flash Flood, Tornado, Blizzard or any other weather/disaster

situation, you need "Go Bags" for your family. If you have not thought about what you need to have in place for your beloved GBGV and other family pets now is the time.

Living in SW Florida we encounter numerous weather emergencies and we have come under mandatory evacuations for both fire and hurricane on several occasions. All of us living in the house have 'Go Bags' at the ready; including Bailey Boo our GBGV. In his bag I have collar/harness, leash, wipes, poop bags, towels (the small micro travel ones are perfect, they are in their own case) travel water and food bowels, empty large water bottle, copy of vaccines, license, vet info/phone numbers.

In addition to his go bag, I always have a minimum of one extra 40lb unopened bag of food as a part of his disaster plan. (I typically have two in the house) His medications are kept in one location, in a small bin, that can be grabbed quickly. I have a reminder list in the bag for review to ensure I have it all before heading out the door.

A new addition was added just this past fall – Contact Information on friends and/or potential boarding locations who can assist if I need to place him. As Hurricane Milton approached in

Sept 2024, we had an acquaintance who was traveling out of the country. The business where they boarded their dog, contacted them and said they were closing and all dogs needed to be picked up within five hours!

Through frantic calls and FB posts they were able to find someone to pick their pup up and care for her until they returned stateside. This was a very prominent dog care facility in our town, and a very unexpected action. *If nothing else, it is something to make note of when boarding, what is their disaster plan? Are they going to expect your dog to be picked up on a moment's notice?*

I can tell you from experience when the sheriff's car pulls in to tell you to get out because of wildfire your brain goes to a different place. Having your bag and list ready makes it much easier. I just grabbed Bailey's medication bin from the cabinet, put it in his go bag, threw his 40lb bag of unopened food and crate into the SUV. Now he is ready to load up.

Hopefully you may never have to use your disaster plan, however it sure is easier when the plan and go bags are at the ready. Make your Grand Plan today.

Board of Directors Meeting Minutes

18 September 2024

Roll Call - Present: Corey Benedict, Barbara Miller, Brent Humphrey, Jane Jonas, Cindy Wilt, Tiffany Cannon, Kitty Steidel, Micky Ford **Excused Absence:** Laura Offerdahl
Meeting called to order at 7:05pm (Eastern), by the President, Corey Benedict

Report of the President: Corey reported that the Blue Grass Specialty in Lexington was great. We had fourteen entries and six shows.

Report of the Vice President: No report at this time.

Report of the Secretary: The minutes of the July 17th, 2024 Board meeting were circulated to the Board members prior to the meeting for review with a corrected version also sent. Motion #01-09-24 Brent moved to accept the minutes as circulated. Barb seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Report of the Treasurer: The report reflected an operating balance of \$12,906.80. The majority of the money spent this year went to the trophy fund and donations to the specialties. Brent has already sent three letters for membership renewal dues which is the main income throughout the year. He's had very little response. More discussion follows in Membership. The report will be placed on file.

Committee Reports

2025 National/Regional: Under the Specialties, everything is in order. Applications have been given to the judges; both are pended with AKC and just waiting for approval. Jolanda Huisman will judge the Nationals on Saturday, we need a judge for Friday Sweepstakes. Any information should be sent to Barbara or Brent

Foundation: Barb said there is nothing new to report.

Newsletter: Brent is waiting for result photos from the Nationals before he finishes the Newsletter which should only be a couple more weeks.

Membership: Brent stated that we lost twelve members who did not renew. Four of those were regular members, eight were associate members. There was discussion about how to get more members with suggestion of calling owners and trying to persuade them to join or renew their membership. Jane led discussion about who dropped out, were they associates who got a puppy, read the Newsletter and just dropped out. Brent said that two were no longer breeders, puppy buyers get excited, but they don't understand why we need the to continue their membership. Tiffany offered information on how the PBGVs (which is a bigger group) handle membership by use of their magazine having photo contests for the cover and a calendar. Brent suggested a motion to extend membership renewal by another 30 days and reaching out to members who did not renew. Cindy said she'd make the calls to those members. Motion #2-09-24 Discussion continued with Cindy suggesting a calendar which Brent said did not sell well previously. Cindy also suggested setting up a new Facebook account and running a contest with a theme and putting the winner's dog on the new fb page for a month or two. Prior to the contest the information would be put in the Newsletter. Cindy offered to look into calendar costs. Jane suggested t-shirts for members who bring in new members and also having the breeders include the membership fee in the sale price. Brent and Corey had previously tried that but found that buyers didn't renew. A new discussion breeder in the US, the lack of commitment, breeders didn't have the success that they had anticipated so they gave up. Meeting the breed was also discussed as well as how we can attract and retain members.

Judges Ed: Kitty did a session in Houston with Cindy and Kitty supplying the dogs. Corey did four ringside sessions with judges and has been doing several virtual sessions every 3-4 months.

Health: After long leg blood samples were submitted, it was indicated that there was a need for certain dogs in the pedigrees to submit DNA samples. All owners were asked and graciously submitted blood samples. We are waiting for Liz to respond with information.

Breed Preservation: Covered in previous discussions.

Unfinished Business: None

Other: None

New Business: Gretchen Tanenbaum an AKC delegate and meet the breed representative wants to address the board with her concerns about breed preservation.

Motion #02-09-24 Brent motioned to let Gretchen speak at the November meeting, but only in her part of the meeting. Cindy seconded the motion. Motion passed.

2024 Nominating Committee: Corey, Cindy, Laura, and Micky are all up for re-election. Brent suggested Barbara chair this year and pick her members, Barbara agreed to be the chair. Motion #03-09-24 Brent motioned to accept Barbara; Micky seconded it. Motion passed.

20 November 2024

Meeting called to order at 7:00pm (Eastern), by the President, Corey Benedict

Report of the President: Corey welcomed Jane who in turn gave a summarization of her background. Corey also reported that Allison did a Pet Fair, she was sent information from the Grand Club, and she was able to hand out pamphlets.

Report of the Vice President: No report currently.

Report of the Secretary: The minutes of the September 18th, 2024 Board meeting were circulated to the Board members prior to the meeting for review with a corrected version also sent. Motion #01-11-24 Brent moved to accept the minutes as circulated. Jane seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Report of the Treasurer: The report reflected an operating balance of \$11,496.91. We did receive some money; Cindy called the members who had not previously renewed. The report will be placed on file.

Committee Reports

2025 National/Regional

The Nationals will be held in Perry, Ga in April. Brent reported that we have received approval from AKC, and both judges have accepted. Sidney will judge the Sweepstakes and Jolanda Huisman will be the judge for the National. There will be more information coming. Brent noted that we need money for trophies, Corey asked about the foundations donating and it was stated that they do support by providing items for the auction. Brent stated that part of the combined cluster is to help support the entries and the cluster provides many opportunities to show dogs and see our dogs.

Motion #02-11-24 Barb moved to have a Specialty at the Blue Grass Cluster in August/September of 2025, Brent seconded. Motion passed. Discussion started on cutting back pack classes (Bitch & Dam) if there are not any entries. Motion #03-11-24 Brent motioned to eliminate them; Kitty seconded. Motioned passed.

Foundation: Barb reported there is nothing new, the Foundation is looking for areas to donate money. Corey mentioned that Gretchen wanted to donate to the canine Health Foundation which led to discussion about keeping the money in the breed and in research on long legs. Jane inquired about seizure disorders of the breed, asking if it is a concern in the breed, how it affects pet owners. Corey noted that epilepsy is not breed specific. It was noted that epilepsy and seizures are two different illnesses.

Newsletter: Brent led this discussion by saying that it is hard to get content. He encouraged others to submit items. Jane suggested that Corey do a section on grooming, not just for show dogs but also for companion dogs. It was suggested to call the section "Groomers Corner." Brent suggested that Jane write a third person article on the requirements for VCD1.

Membership: As previously mentioned, Cindy called non-renewal members and was able to get some of them to renew. When Corey saw Gretchen in Philadelphia, she mentioned that dogs from Tamara will be joining the club. Brent suggested that all breeders should include membership papers with the puppy purchase papers. It was suggested that the membership fee be included with the purchase price. Brent said he and Corey had tried that but found that buyers did not renew their membership. Discussion turned to lack of breeders in the US, the lack of commitment, breeders did not have the success that they had anticipated so they gave up. The topic wrapped up with discussion about meeting the breed and how to get and retain more members.

Judges Ed: Kitty said there is not anything new to add, she doesn't get many requests for information. She will have some donations for the hound group show on February 1. Corey has done several virtual sessions, Nancy has presented a few from her kennel.

Health: Nothing new to report.

Breed Preservation: Corey reported that Gretchen wants to support entry for the Charleston shows in January, there will be 4-5 grans at that show.

Unfinished Business: Nothing to report.

New Business: Corey started the discussion on Meet the Breed at Westminster. Gretchen will spearhead it for 2026. Discussion centered around the challenge of getting people on the east coast who are willing to travel to Westminster with their dogs, it's a lot to deal with in Manhattan in loading and unloading the dogs, having dogs that are a good representation of the breed, with good temperament. Jane added that AKC's website has photos, we could showcase the dogs on the club website giving breeder information, have a section of grans in the ring, with ribbons showing how well they are doing with rally and scent work, that they are more than just a pretty face. Photos could show companion events for potential puppy owners, a broader purpose other than just companions. Also showing our hounds titled. Jane offered to compile information on barn hunt and rally so people can see our hounds do more than show and confirmation, etc. Brent said he has that information from AKC. It was suggested to put in the Newsletter a section that Joy has on a site which is about Life with Grans as an incentive for puppy owners to see what the dogs can be trained to do and what it is like to live with them. Corey started discussion on expanding the website with a tab for GBGV Success and Wins showing all activities of the breed, rally, barn hunt, etc. Also showing stats and photos from confirmation and companion events. The site needs to be more informative. We'll see if Terry and add a tab so content can be provided.

Mission Statement....



Title-02981: Genome-wide Identification and Characterization of Peptide Epitopes from *Ehrlichia canis* and *Anaplasma platys* with Potential to be used as Vaccine Candidates

- Ehrlichiosis and anaplasmosis are tick-borne bacterial infections that can affect dogs, cats, and people. They are related to rickettsial diseases and can cause serious health issues if left untreated:
- Dogs with ehrlichiosis or anaplasmosis often experience fever, lethargy, joint pain, and weakness. Other symptoms include depression, anorexia, weight loss, vomiting, diarrhea, and coughing. In more severe cases, dogs may experience bleeding disorders, anemia, seizures, or coma.
- A veterinarian can diagnose ehrlichiosis and anaplasmosis by considering tick exposure and running a series of diagnostic tests, including blood tests to check for antibodies.
- A veterinarian will typically treat ehrlichiosis and anaplasmosis with antibiotics such as doxycycline or tetracycline. Dogs should be treated daily for four weeks.

The GBGVCA Foundation Board would like to thank board member Terry Howell for his research and presentation on the study. We are excited to finally be in the position to donate and support this worthy Canine Health Foundation project.
